Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Ephesians 6:17

The class I'm taking this semester is call "Catechesis" which simply means teaching or instruction, especially Christian instruction. I've learned a great deal in the course and one of the things that repeatedly comes up during class is the importance of catechesis or teaching in the church.

As my instructor, Dr. Steven Hein, says, "You have a death problem." We all have this problem. Once you are baptized, you belong to God and the devil wants you back. He is sneaky and tricky, and he'll do what he can to snatch you out of life in Christ and return you to the land of the dead. You either die and live with Christ, or you just die. This sounds pretty grim, but it is true.

An additional truth, however, is that our Lord does

NOT leave us alone to fight this battle. He is with us, he guides us, battles for us, and prepares us. He prepares us through his word, his promise. Remember how Jesus defeated Satan in the wilderness? He quoted scripture. The Word defeats the devil. Therefore, we need to be constantly filling our spirits with the Word. We need to feed on the goodness of the promise so that we are strengthen for the battles. We need nourishment of the Word iust as we require nourishment for our physical bodies. We don't eat lunch one time and think, "Shew, I'll never have to do that again!" No, we need to refill our physical tank often. Likewise, our spiritual tank requires feasting on the Gospel. Knowing who we are because of Whose we are takes some constant reminding.

#### **Educational Opportunities**

Why Bible Study and continued learning for Christians? If you've survived confirmation class in your teens aren't you done with Christian education? The short answer is, "No, you are not." Why is Christian learning a life-long endeavor? To keep you alive! Since your baptism the evil one has been out to get you. When this one tempted our Lord in the desert, Jesus defeated him with the words of Scripture. If you are to be armed for this spiritual warfare, you need constant practice wielding the sword which is the word of truth. Don't be fooled, Satan has not left you alone. He is after you at all times. 1 Peter 5:8 says, "Like a roaring lion your adversary the devil prowls around, looking for someone to devour." We need to study on our own and gather for instruction frequently for our own growth and maturity in the Spirit, to be armed for spiritual warfare and to be primed to serve our neighbors in our vocations.

FF offers a variety of Bible studies and learning opportunities. The 10:00 a.m. **Sunday school hour** has moved to the conference room (the room off of the sanctuary) and will be reviewing the book of Malachi before the worship service. From 12:15-1:15 on Sundays the **Catechism Class** meets in the Conference room. Also, from 12:15-1:00, **Lunch and Lesson** is offered to children of all ages. This mixed aged class offers children's music at 12:15, Lunch at 12:30 followed by a lesson and craft or activity. Tuesdays at 10:00 is the **Ladies Bible Study** hour and Wednesday evening 6-7:00 p.m. is the **Galatians study**. And, just a reminder, all who enjoy singing or just hanging out with those who do like to sing (an exceptionally fun group, by the way), are invited to choir practice on Wed. evenings at 5:15.

New Bible Studies are on the horizon. Please prayerfully consider leading a **Home Bible Study** group. This would be a group of people that you gather in your home, in a coffee shop, in the park, or anywhere else you'd like to meet. Round up family, friends and neighbors and pick a time to meet each week to work through Paul's letter to the Galatians. The Home Leaders will meet for class prior to teaching their own groups. Each week the leaders will gather to go over the study and so will be prepared to lead their own gathered group.
