

2022 LCMC Annual Gathering in Lakeville, MN

The theme of the AG was Discipleship in a complicated world. Pastor Wollan talked about "Walking the Talk." He described discipleship as an understanding of who you are, who Jesus is, and what Jesus has done for the Who that you are. You are a new creation that dies and rises with Christ each day. In the Kingdom message is our hope. The Kingdom comes only by power of the King. This gives us hope and God receives the glory. The King teaches us and calls for our response to serve the neighbor.
